


10. ADD A TABLE

We're going to change our My Favourite Books page so that it shows a table listing our top five books and showing marks out of ten for each of the books. Here's how it will look:

1. Start by adding the following selectors to your [simple.css](#) file:

    background-color: silver;
}

th, td {
    vertical-align: top;
    padding: 0.5em;
    text-align: left;
}
```

Add the table to your [books.html page](#). Here is some code to get you started:


